

### WHAT TO DO WHEN WE CANNOT ATTEND MASS?

We are encouraged to make a 'spiritual communion' as it will strengthen our "desire for the sacrament of the Eucharist" (St John Paul II). Saint Teresa of Jesus wrote: 'When you do not receive communion and you do not attend Mass, you can make a "spiritual communion", which is a most beneficial practice; by it the love of God will be greatly impressed on you."

**How Do I Make a "Spiritual Communion"?** Alone or together with others in your household, make the sign of the cross. You could read the Gospel of the day. Then share prayer intentions quietly or aloud. Say the Lord's Prayer, then make an act of spiritual communion.

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen. Close with the sign of the cross.

Pope Francis's Prayer to Mary during Coronavirus Pandemic: O Mary, you always shine on our path as a sign of salvation and of hope. We entrust ourselves to you, Health of the Sick, who at the cross took part in Jesus' pain, keeping your faith firm. You, Salvation of Your People, know what we need, and we are sure you will provide so that, as in Cana of Galilee, we may return to joy and to feasting after this time of trial. Help us, Mother of Divine Love, to conform to the will of the Father and to do as we are told by Jesus, who has taken upon himself our sufferings and carried our sorrows to lead us, through the cross, to the joy of the resurrection. Amen. Under your protection, we seek refuge, Holy Mother of God. Do not disdain the entreaties of we who are in trial, but deliver us from every danger, O glorious and blessed Virgin. Amen.

Bishop Patrick Leo McCartie was born in Hartlepool on the 5th September 1925. He studied for the priesthood at St Mary's College, Oscott and was ordained priest on the 17th July 1949 at St Teresa's, Trent Vale in Staffordshire. He spent a year as an assistant priest at St Chad's Cathedral, followed by six years on the teaching staff at Cotton College and as assistant priest in St Wilfrid's, Cotton. After relatively short spells as an assistant priest in parishes in Birmingham, Wolverhampton and then Wednesbury, he was made the Diocesan Inspector of Schools in 1962. In 1968 he was made the Administrator of St Chad's Cathedral. On 20 May 1977, Bishop Leo was ordained as an Auxiliary Bishop of Birmingham and Titular Bishop of Elmham. In February 1990, he was appointed as the tenth Bishop of Northampton where he served until his retirement in 2001. Following his retirement, Bishop Leo lived at Aston Hall before moving to St Joseph's Home, Harborne in 2012. On 17th July, 2019, Bishop Leo celebrated 70 years of priestly ministry surrounded by bishops, priests, family and friends and the community at St Joseph's Home.
