Private Mass Times

Fr will celebrate Mass every day at 9.30am for the intentions of the parish.

Public Mass Times Sunday 30th August 10.00 am Sunday 6th September 10.00am We currently have only one public Mass on Sunday morning at 10.00am. As congregation numbers increase and as government restrictions allow we will look to reinstate weekday masses. We are currently unable to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation in Church. If you would like Fr to hear your confession he would be happy to do this after Mass one Sunday or in an outdoor space. Fr will shortly be resuming Baptismal preparation classes for those parents wishing to have their child Baptised. These classes will run for 2 consecutive weeks after Sunday morning Mass. Whilst the same restrictions on numbers of people in our Church at one time apply, it is now possible for Baptisms, Weddings and Funerals to be conducted in Church.

There is no obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days. Instead you are encouraged to attend on other available days or to watch live streamed Masses.

Some people MUST NOT come to Mass. If you are shielded, self isolating, ill, have symptoms of Covid 19 or are generally infirm and maybe over 70, you should stay at home.

The maximum number who can be accommodated in our Church at any one time is 55. Face coverings must be worn, covering both nose and mouth. Please bring your own if possible.

Hand gel will be provided and should be used on entering and leaving the church. Please observe the one way system in place and take a seat as directed by the stewards. You must remain in your seat for the duration of Mass. Small children must remain with parents during Mass.

In case of a medical emergency please remain in your seat and make a steward aware. In any other emergency again please stay seated and follow the stewards instructions.

During Mass there may be some music, provided by Nancy and her family or recorded music, but there should be no congregational singing. At the sign of the peace, there will be no handshake or physical contact. There will be no offertory procession during the Mass. There will be collection baskets at the exit point. Fr will bring communion to you in your seat. Please remain seated and outstretch your arm to increase the distance between yourself and Fr. If you require a blessing, please indicate this in the usual way with your right arm across your chest. After the final blessing please leave the Church immediately. There will be an opportunity to light votive candles on the way out of church.

Feel free - if the weather permits - to engage in socially distanced chatting outside the Church building or in the car park, maintaining social distancing.
