Sunday Obligation:

Since the beginning of the Covid pandemic, until the present time, we have shared with you our judgment that the situation of the last two years has meant that the Sunday Obligation has been impeded and has needed to be fulfilled in other ways. We thank God that this situation has now changed. "The pressing challenges of the pandemic have lessened significantly. Most people have resumed the wide range of normal activities, no longer restricted by the previous Covid measures. We therefore believe that the reasons which have prevented Catholics from attending Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation no longer apply. "We understand there will still be some members of our congregations who, for reasons of health, do not feel safe enough to return to Mass. It has always been the understanding of the Church that when the freedom of any Catholic to attend Mass in person is impeded for a serious reason, because of situations such as ill health, care for the sick or legitimate fear, this is not a breach of the Sunday Obligation." We still have much work to do in terms of repairs and maintenance of our buildings. We achieved so much last year with a new roof on the church centre and roof repairs to the church and presbytery, outside lighting, new soffits and fascia boards on the whole site, refurbished church toilet, improved safety to the presbytery and a refurbished bathroom but the list continues. Sue would welcome any help with continuing addressing the further repairs required. Each repair is a job in itself to get completed in terms of sourcing contractors, obtaining quotes, raising funds and ultimately overseeing the works. Many hands make light work!

A parent of the child to be baptised must be baptised, attend Sunday Mass regularly and undertake the preparation meetings.

Marriage: Please contact Fr Mathew initially to discuss your request for marriage.
