

The theme for 2022 is "Rise Up!" "Mary arose and went with haste" based on Lk 1:39

World Youth Sunday reminds us that as young people we must commit again to use the energy, gifts, talents we have in new ways.

In August 2023, Pope Francis will gather with hundreds of thousands of young people for World Youth Day, in Lisbon, and the theme there is the verse from Luke's Gospel: "Mary arose and left with haste (Lk 1:38)."Our theme is consciously linked to this.

Today there will be a Second Collection for the Catholic Youth Service. Our youth will be leading Mass for us and sharing with us what each of them have gained from their parish, with the support of the Catholic Youth Service, in their faith journey. They may even serve us with light refreshments after Mass. Please support them generously.

Next Sunday marks the First Sunday of Advent. A period to "Prepare and be ready", "Watch and wait".

We get impatient with God's plan. We wander. We choose our own plans instead. God is faithful though. He calls us to return to Him. God's plan is not about getting what we want. It is about God restoring

the whole world to himself. In our lives we will experience events which we don't understand. There will be senseless tragedies and undeserved triumphs. We must be vigilant and ready for those, especially for trials and

difficulties. There are always uncertainties in life. We must be ready at all times to serve Christ when we encounter the Lord in our daily lives.
