He invites us to overcome barriers, banish prejudices and draw near to those around us every day in order to rediscover the grace of everyday life. Dear brother, dear sister: if on this night you are experiencing an hour of darkness, a day that has not yet dawned, a light dimmed or a dream shattered, open your heart with amazement to the message of "Do not be afraid, he has risen!" Pope Francis.

Based on the gospel for Sunday 21st May, Seventh Sunday of Easter: John 17:1-11

"Eternal life is this: to know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent."

The Last Supper is the setting for this gospel, and it is one of the most intense prayers Jesus prayed the night before the Crucifixion. Here we are reminded of it again just before Pentecost and informed that our mission is the same as the apostles, to preach the Good News everywhere. It is a lifelong mission. We may not always be conscious of it, and we may fail in carrying it out many times, but God can "write straight with crooked lines". Our goal as Christians is eternal life with and in the Trinity. In his prayer Jesus uses the word "know" frequently. He wants us to know God as God knows us. Jesus asks us to show our belief in him by our words and actions. By loving one another and reaching out to those who are poor and marginalised in any way. The Easter message is that Christ is with us still. So let us go, like the apostles, into our troubled world and share the Good News that Jesus lives and that he loves and knows each one of us intimately through all that we do.

Trusting in God, who has invited us to be the messengers of the Good News, let us go forth with courage and hope in God's name.
