# "Forgive your brother from your heart."

Forgiveness can be one of the most challenging aspects of Jesus' teaching, however much we might think of ourselves as a loving and tolerant person, particularly if we feel we've been wronged. Nelson Mandela spent 27 years of his life in prisons, enduring many hardships and unable to attend the funerals of his mother and son. Yet when he emerged from captivity, he wasn't driven by feelings of bitterness, revenge and hatred towards those who'd taken away his freedom. Instead, he sought to build a new South Africa with a selfless message of reconciliation and forgiveness, telling his people "You will achieve more in this world through acts of mercy than you will through acts of retribution". Our world today is troubled by many wars between countries, civil wars, internal conflicts and ethnic and religious violence. It is estimated one quarter of our global population lives in conflict-affected areas, with the poorest and most vulnerable often paying the highest price. Conflict may be fueled by legacies of the past or give rise to continued feelings of injustice between peoples. Nelson Mandela also observed "Reconciliation does not mean forgetting or trying to bury the pain of conflict but working together to correct the legacy of past injustice". May the spirit of reconciliation not only bring an end to conflicts, but also a just resolution of differences, so all may live in lasting peace. Through our campaigning and prayers to end to conflict and injustice, may we be witnesses of Christ's message of forgiveness. Lord Jesus, you taught us to forgive one another May all peoples of our world learn to see each other as a brother or sister to be loved. Where there is conflict, may true reconciliation and healing bring about lasting peace. Amen.
