Based on the gospel for Sunday 12 November, Thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time: Matthew 25:1-13: "The foolish ones did take their lamps, but they brought no oil, whereas the sensible ones took flasks of oil as well as their lamps." In this parable, Jesus tells the story of ten bridesmaids who are waiting for the arrival of the bridegroom. As practical people, we may side with the wise women in this story. But maybe this is not so simple. The wise women had enough oil to share. In society, this would mean not pointing the finger of blame, but instead ensuring that marginalised and vulnerable people are not excluded and have shared and equal access to resources. This is why CAFOD provides long-term support to equip people with the skills, tools and opportunities to live with dignity, support their families and give back to their communities and why CAFOD campaigns call for the change needed to create a just and equitable society.
