Reflection:3rd Sunday of Advent: Mary Waits with the Word

There must be times during pregnancy when waiting for the baby to arrive is exciting. There must also be times when it is frustrating. There could also be times of fear, of expectation, of hope, of joy, of confusion. During the nine months of waiting, there could be so many different and opposing feelings. Being open to the Word, receiving the Word into our lives and allowing him to grow in us and change us, leads us to the mystery of waiting with the Word. During Mary's pregnancy we know of two journeys, one to her cousin Elizabeth and one to Bethlehem where she gives birth. The rest of the time we might assume that Mary waited. Advent is a time of preparation and joyful expectation. As we prepare for the birth of Our Lord, Jesus Christ, these weeks provide a wonderful opportunity to slow down and reflect.

We look forward to the coming of Christ: celebrating His birth, His renewed coming into our lives this Christmas, especially through the Eucharist, and His second coming at the end of time. Advent marks the start of the Church's liturgical year.

Advent comes from the Latin adventus, meaning 'arrival' or 'coming'. Each Gospel reading during Advent has a distinctive theme: the Lord's coming at the end of time (First Sunday of Advent), John the Baptist (Second and Third Sunday), and the events that prepared immediately for the Lord's birth (Fourth Sunday). Advent- A period to "Prepare and be ready, Watch and wait".

We get impatient with God's plan. We wander. We choose our own plans instead. God is faithful though. He calls us to return to Him. God's plan is not about getting what we want. It is about God restoring the whole world to himself. In our lives we will experience events which we don't understand. There will be senseless tragedies and undeserved triumphs. We must be vigilant and ready for those, especially for trials and difficulties. There are always uncertainties in life. We must be ready at all times to serve Christ when we encounter the Lord in our daily lives. The four Sundays of Advent each have a specific theme or focus- Hope, Love, Joy and Peace.

As we light our third candle on our Advent Wreath, the candle of Joy, we remember that the third Sunday of Advent is called "Gaudete" Sunday. Each Sunday in the season of Advent is supposed to be feast day, a celebration, but this week is especially so. The third week of Advent is a time of joy, a time of being thankful for all that has been given—the promise of the Saviour who has come, who is present, and who promises a return.
