Baptism of the Lord Reflection from Fr Ryan Service: Back in the 1960s in Milan, the council were developing the metro underground system and were stopped in their tracks. They found an ancient crypt underneath the main Cathedral. Among the ruins and dust, they found an octagonal shape that can be seen with steps going down one side into what was obviously a pool and with steps going up out of the other side. This was no ancient roman spa bath but a baptismal pool. In 387 a man called Augustine was baptised by Ambrose in that pool, being immersed into the water three times before coming out of the waters on the other side, robed in white, to be greeted by community members.

For those of us who are baptised, even if we were not plunged into the pools in the dramatic style of Augustine, the reality is precisely the same. We entered that same pool of life, that pool of history and tradition, the same waters that re-birth sinners, saints and popes, the waters that Jesus entered in the Jordan, the flow of history. Yet, like those ruins buried deep under il duomo, our faith and hope, at times, need to be uncovered and renewed. For years that place was thought to be lost, then just a myth (non-existent). For years it was covered by dirt, gravel, and rubble. Perhaps it existed once, but no more. But it was always there, waiting to be uncovered, waiting to be restored, waiting to be seen again. In our difficulties, may God help us to excavate our

Preaching on the feast of the Epiphany, St Oscar Romero spoke of the Magi searching in the darkness for a mystical light, shining as a sign of God present to all the nations, through his Son who would bring universal salvation and wellbeing. At a time of increasing conflict in El Salvador it was, he said, time to heed Pope St Paul VI's call "No to violence! Yes to peace". Journeying to pay homage to the infant King, the Magi may have followed the path taken by Mary and Joseph from Nazareth. Today this would take them through a land aching under years of conflict, a Holy Land which is not a place of peace. Bethlehem is now partly surrounded by a wall, once depicted by the artist Banksy with Mary & Joseph on one side, the stable with the star above on the other. A wall seen by some as an essential means of protection, by others a sign of occupation and a barrier to freedom. As we witness the latest conflict in Israel and the occupied Palestinian territory, let us hope that one day the light of true peace and reconciliation may emerge from the darkness of war. May there be peace and justice for all for whom Abraham is one father in faith, in the Holy Land where the Prince of Peace was born, taught, and died for us all.

Lord Jesus, Prince of Peace, may your light shine for all the nations, to follow the path to reconciliation and peace. May all people live together in freedom and without fear, walking side by side on the road to Bethlehem and throughout the Holy Land. Amen.
