## Fifth Lent Reflection on Prayer - Stations of the Cross

One of the beautiful Lenten disciplines we undertake is praying the Stations of the Cross. St Francis of Assisi, at the time when pilgrims were unable to go to the Holy Land because of the Crusades, was the first person we know of to encourage a prayer procession using a sequence of scenes from the passion and death of Christ. Through the following centuries, a range of sets of 'stations' were used throughout the Church. In the 18th century St Alphonsus of Liguori composed a set of reflections and prayers based on a set of 14 stations. Partly through the popularity of St Alphonsus' 'Way of the Cross', this set of 14 stations now adorns many Catholic churches, and his prayers and reflections are still popular today.

In St Alphonsus's prayers, at each station, we pray: "I love you Jesus, my love above all things. I repent with my whole heart for having offended you. Never permit me to separate myself from you again. Grant that I may love you always and then do with me what you will."

It is one of my favourite prayers throughout the year, but especially in Lent. There is so much in it that I find it difficult to focus my heart on all the phrases at once. This year I find myself drawn most often to the phrase, "Never permit me to separate myself from you again." Read through the prayer slowly and ask yourself, "Which phrase do I find myself most drawn to?"

# Based on the gospel for Sunday 17 March, Fifth Sunday of Lent: John 12: 20-30

"Unless a wheat grain falls on the ground and dies, it remains only a single grain; but if it dies, it yields a rich harvest." Jesus knows that the hour is coming for him to be glorified. Reflecting on this reading, Brother Myers, a pastor in Liberia, shared these thoughts:

"Jesus was talking about his death. He was trying to say that if the Son of Man doesn't go to the cross, salvation won't take place. Deliverance won't take place. Before the wheat germinates, it needs to die. Jesus says he has come to die, he will be resurrected, the gospel will spread.... He was talking about himself when he was talking about the wheat.

"The seed must die to bear fruit. Healing will come. He must die to be resurrected. Go to the cross, redeem your life." In today's reading, Jesus is clear that he cannot turn away from what lies ahead. Let us, then, not turn away from the difficult things that lie in our future, or that we can see in the world around us at this time. Instead, we trust that God is with us as we face them, and as we walk alongside one another seeking a future of peace and justice for all.

God of sacrifices, help us to follow you and to serve you. Lead us to new life with you and work through us so that we may better reflect our kingdom of peace here on earth. Amen.
