Send forth your Spirit, O Lord, and Renew the Face of the Earth

The feast of Pentecost, which we celebrate this weekend, is not to be minimalised!

The Spirit is active in each of our hearts, and throughout the Church, whether it be in family prayers, in parish or diocesan celebrations, or in the whole body of Christ which is his universal Church. We are called now and each day to invite the Spirit's energy and love to guide and make fully alive out thoughts, our prayers and our actions.

The original Jewish feart of Pentecost celebrated a grain crop, grown from seed, ripened, and now producing its harvest. Our lives filled with the Holy Spirit have the power to be fruitful beyond our imagining. "Send forth your Spirit, O Lord, and renew the face of the earth" is one choice of response for the Responsorial Psalm (Ps 103 [104]) for the liturgy of the Mass of Pentecost. It comes from verse 30 of that psalm which speaks of the power of the Spirit of God working through all of creation.

In Pope Francis's great document on Creation, Laudato Si, he laments the human evil which can destroy the beauty of creation, but even where such harm has been done, he lifts our spirits by reminding us of what the power of the Holy Spirit can achieve in cooperation with willing human hearts ... "The work of the Church seeks not only to remind everyone of the duty to care for nature, but at the same time "she must above all protect mankind from self- destruction" Yet God, who wishes to work with us and who counts on our cooperation, can also bring good out of the evil we have done.

"The Holy Spirit can be said to possess an infinite creativity, proper to the divine mind, which knows how to loosen the knots of human affairs, including the most complex and inscrutable". "Creating a world in need of development, God in some way sought to limit himself in such a way that many of the things we think of as evils, dangers or sources of suffering, are in reality part of the pains of childbirth which he uses to draw us into the act of cooperation with the Creator." (Laudato Si 79/80)

Reflection by Fr Rob Taylerson

Based on the gospel for Sunday 19 May, Pentecost: John 15:26-27; 16:12-15 "And you too will be witnesses."

On Pentecost Sunday, Jesus tells the Apostles that he will send the "Spirit of Truth" from the Father and that they are to be his witnesses. Just as the first Apostles boldly proclaimed the message of Jesus at the first Pentecost, we too, as spirit-filled people, are called to be his witnesses today.

St Paul describes the signs of the Spirit as love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, trustfulness, gentleness and self-control. We may fail to live up to this ideal, but perhaps re-energised by the Spirit this Pentecost we can strive once again to witness to the Spirit of Truth.

Our world today needs more than ever a Spirit of Truth so that the rights of all people and our environment, both at home and abroad, are respected. So, as well as endeavouring to witness to the Spirit by the way we live out our day-to-day lives, we could call upon our politicians and all those in power to advance respect for all people and our planet. By tapping into the Spirit of Truth in prayer, aided by the gifts of knowledge, understanding, wisdom, right judgement, piety, courage and fear of the Lord, may we discern how we can be witnesses for Jesus today.

Spirit of Truth, fill us, teach us, guide us, empower us to witness to the Truth in the way we live our lives. Amen.

Pentecost will be celebrated on Sunday 19 May, fifty days after Easter Sunday. It commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon Our Lady and the Apostles.

Please take a copy of the Archbishops letter which has been placed at the back of church. This was read out at Mass a few weeks ago but includes important information regarding the reduction of serving priests and the consequences on the number of parishes expected within our Archdiocese moving forward. It is so important that we, as witnesses to Jesus Christ, continue to follow the example given to the Apostles and do our bit in maintaining our churches. Through our baptism we all have a share in the Priesthood of Christ and that invests in all of us a responsibility for the future of the Church. The Archbishops letter calls for all parishes to establish pastoral councils to assist parishes, and recently formed clusters, to move from collaboration to co-responsibility for the local mission of the Church. The pastoral councils will act as consultative bodies, informing and guiding the decisions that need to be taken forward as we look to the future of our churches and parishes. Thus, they will help us prepare for a closer working together of neighbouring parishes, with the likelihood of fewer clergy, the possible merger of parishes and the likely need to close some of our churches in the years ahead.

The first meeting will be held at St Peters and Pauls church on Friday 24th May 6.00pm.

Each parish is expected to bring along 4 parishioners who would be willing to establish a parish council for our parish. Refreshments will be provided. It would be wonderful if St Gerard's parish was well represented. Please consider if you would be able to attend and if so, let Fr know. As I say at this stage it is understanding the nature of the pastoral councils and the pastoral priorities of each parish.
