Reflection: Based on the gospel for Sunday 1 September, Twenty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time: Mark 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23

"Nothing that goes into someone from outside can make that person unclean; it is the things that come out of someone that make that person unclean."

The Pharisees, as we see in today's reading, kept rules that dated back to Old Testament times, when the children of Israel needed to set themselves apart from the idolaters of the surrounding culture. In the New Testament, the idea of being set apart is still present but in a totally different sense: Jesus' values are uncompromising, and we are called to be in the world but not of it. What does this really mean for us? If we look more closely at the list of sins in Mark 7:21–22, we can see that they are all offences against love. Faith breaks down walls between people and leads to reconciliation. Our values should set us apart, yes, but in the paradoxical sense of bringing us closer to others. Pope Francis said, "Let us imitate Jesus: he goes to the streets" (address, 14 June 2014). We, the Ordinary People of the Streets is the English translation of a book by the French social activist and Venerable Madeleine Delbrêl, another of whose works has just appeared in English. I am challenged by her journey from unbelief through an interest in Carmelite spirituality to a commitment to ordinariness as a means of solidarity and thus as a way to love. I find this an inspiring example because it mirrors my own spiritual trajectory.

Lord, help us to commit to your values and look at how we can, through prayer and action, live in solidarity with our fellow humans. Amen.
