Education Sunday is marked this year on 8 September - just after the new academic year starts. The theme for 2024 is, "He makes the deaf hear and the dumb speak", taken from St Mark's Gospel (7:31-37). Education Sunday is one of the oldest Days of Special Prayer in England and Wales, established 175 years ago in 1848. It provides an opportunity to celebrate and give thanks to all involved in making Catholic schools places of enlightenment, as well as to look forward in anticipation of the year ahead

Reflection: Based on the gospel for Sunday 8 September, Twenty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time: Mark 7: 31-37

"Then, looking up to heaven Jesus sighed; and he said to him 'Ephphatha' that is 'Be opened.""

In today's Gospel we see Jesus at work in the 'pagan' Decapolis region, a place of Greek non-Jews. It was seen as an unclean region and looked down on by the Jewish community. It may well have been the 'distant land' Jesus had in mind when he told the parable of the prodigal son. Jesus, however, does not feel obliged to steer clear of such places but, rather, offers this region, too, his loving message of forgiveness and healing. As he opens the ears and mouth of this 'foreign' man with a single word, Ephphatha (be opened), so he also opens the minds and hearts of the disciples who were witnesses to his universal compassion.

It's a gospel which certainly has challenges in our own time. Am I able to identify no-go areas for me? Perhaps people and situations I shun, or judge unfairly? Do I feel tied to my own people and place, or to circumstances I know and feel comfortable with? As a disciple, do I feel free enough to follow the Master to unorthodox places, and to people that are different from me? Can I allow him to open the closed places of my heart and to loosen the strictures of my mind, so that I may understand more compassionately, hear more clearly and respond more courageously? Can I then say humbly, but confidently, that Jesus continues to do 'all things well', even in me?

Lord, help me be open to situations, places and people that are different to my own. Help me to show them that they are not forgotten and let me find you already at work in them. Amen.
