Gospel Reflection for Sunday September 22nd 2024, 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time | Mark 9:30-37

In this Gospel passage, Jesus teaches his disciples about true greatness. He tells them that whoever wants to be first must be the servant of all. He then places a child in their midst, showing them that welcoming the least among them is welcoming Him.

The Gospel challenges us to put others first. By serving and loving others selflessly, we follow His example and live out our faith. Instead of seeking power or status, Jesus calls us to serve others, especially those who are in need. This lesson on humility and service is fundamental to us. Serving others with humility, we follow the teaching of Jesus with a genuine care and love for others. Jesus shows us that real greatness is the act of serving others, especially those less fortunate.

Jesus' example of welcoming a child teaches us about humility and trust. Humility is different from timidity or lack of self-esteem. A person who is generous with his or her time and talents can still be humble if they recognize that all that they have comes from God. We are called to have faith like children, trusting God completely and welcoming others with love. This is how we live out our faith.

Let us pray that we can be humble, to serve others with love and to become more like children in our trust of God. True greatness lies in serving others.

"Whoever welcomes one of these little children in my name, welcomes me."

When he was just 4, Hussein Abdi Kahin's father was killed in mass genocide in Somalia. Separated from his mother, he was illegally trafficked to the UK aged 9 to work as a domestic servant. Fostered after starting school, his talent for athletics was spotted and nurtured, leading to multiple Olympic gold medals and other success. We know him as Mo Farah.

Waheed Arian was born in Afghanistan under Soviet occupation. Seriously ill as a child refugee in Pakistan, a doctor's lifesaving treatment inspired him to study medicine. Fleeing civil war he came to the UK aged 15, working and studying to gain a place at Cambridge University. He qualified as a doctor, works in the NHS and has founded a charity to support medical work in conflict zones.

Alan Kurdi was born in Syria during the Civil War. His family moved many times trying to escape the conflict. His final journey was in an overcrowded rubber boat, which capsized in the Mediterranean. He drowned aged 2 years and 2 months. Photographs of his lifeless body washed up on a beach became worldwide news.

UNICEF estimates there are over 10 million child refugees. For some their journey has a happy ending. But not for many others. Last year nearly 50 children drowned every month making the same perilous journey as Alan across the Mediterranean.

May all refugee children find a place of peace and happiness, where they can develop to fulfil their potential and make their contribution to the wellbeing of our world.

Lord Jesus, may our world heed your words. May all refugee children be welcomed. Amen.
