Rejoice this Gaudete Sunday - Third Sunday of Advent: When did you last feel real joy?

Whatever the cause of that joy, what links all joyful experiences is forgetting the burden of time. In today's readings God really has turned on the joy tap. The prophet Zephaniah invites us to "Rejoice and exult with all your heart" and St Paul wants us to "rejoice in the Lord always".

These readings, though, sit uncomfortably next to the bed of the dying, or the lonely, or those waiting for medical test results, those unsure about who they are and where they're going in life. But there, right there, when life hurts, God's promise remains: I want to renew you with my love. The blessedness that God pours into our hearts, even when we don't feel it, is something real and concrete, but it isn't magic. God doesn't rub out the difficult aspects of experience, otherwise we'll be living a Disney-fied life, rather than a human life.

The joy we are reflecting on today does not mean we are skipping around with a smile on our faces like in dental adverts. It's a joy built upon hope. To quote the poet Seamus Heaney: "hope is not optimism, which expects things to turn out well, but something rooted in the conviction that there is good worth working for".

Our waiting is hopeful, even joyful, and it's never in vain.

Parish Mission Statement

We, the members of St Gerard's R.C. Church, are baptised in Jesus Christ, empowered by the spirit, nurtured in community, and nourished by prayer, word and sacrament. Therefore, for the greater glory of God, we proclaim for all people the saving message of the Gospel, and joyfully share our time, talent and resources, in works of mercy and justice, both within and beyond our parish community.

Advent is a time of preparation and joyful expectation. As we prepare for the birth of Our Lord, Jesus Christ, these weeks provide a wonderful opportunity to slow down and reflect. We look forward to the coming of Christ: celebrating His birth, His renewed coming into our lives this Christmas, especially through the Eucharist, and His second coming at the end of time. Advent marks the start of the Church's liturgical year.

Advent comes from the Latin adventus, meaning 'arrival' or 'coming'. Each Gospel reading during Advent has a distinctive theme: the Lord's coming at the end of time (First Sunday of Advent), John the Baptist (Second and Third Sunday), and the events that prepared immediately for the Lord's birth (Fourth Sunday). A period to "Prepare and be ready, Watch and wait". We get impatient with God's plan. We wander. We choose our own plans instead. God is faithful though. He calls us to return to Him. God's plan is not about getting what we want. It is about God restoring the whole world to himself. In our lives we will experience events which we don't understand. There will be senseless tragedies and undeserved triumphs. We must be vigilant and ready for those, especially for trials and difficulties. There are always uncertainties in life. We must be ready at all times to serve Christ when we encounter the Lord in our daily lives. The four Sundays of Advent each have a specific theme or focus- Hope, Love, Joy and Peace.

As we light our third candle on our Advent Wreath, the candle of Joy, we remember that the third Sunday of Advent is called "Gaudete" Sunday. Each Sunday in the season of Advent is supposed to be feast day, a celebration, but this week is especially so. The third week of Advent is a time of joy, a time of being thankful for all that has been given—the promise of the Saviour who has come, who is present, and who promises a return.
