Jubilee Year 2025, "Pilgrims of Hope"

The Jubilee Years, also known as Holy Years, started in 1300AD and recall the great jubilee of Israel: a time for land to be rested and debts to be cancelled, when God called people to be reconciled with one another and with Him. They now occur every 25 years, although the next will be 2033 – the anniversary of Christ's death and resurrection and the decent of the Holy Spirit. These Years, the Church explains, are years "of reconciliation between adversaries, of conversion and receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation, '...and consequently of solidarity, hope, justice, commitment to serve God with joy and in peace with our brothers and sisters'". On Christmas Eve Pope Francis opened the Holy Door at St Peter's Basilica in Rome. This was the Solemn Opening of the Jubilee Year which will continue throughout 2025. During this Holy Year we are invited to become Pilgrims of Hope.

Sunday 19th January Confession 9.30am Mass 10.00am "He will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire." Seeing and hearing John the Baptist in the wilderness, "the people were in expectation." Something new was happening, but the advent of Jesus Christ exceeded and transcended what they had anticipated. In Spes non confundit, the bull of indiction for this Jubilee year, Pope Francis invites us to be Pilgrims of Hope, "a hope that does not disappoint" (Romans 5:5). In particular, Pope Francis calls us to be signs of hope for prisoners, the sick, the young, migrants and the elderly. As we progress through this new year, we should recall the dignity conferred on us at our own baptisms to be priests, prophets and kings, and remember that we have been empowered: "He will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire." Recalling this, may we use our gifts boldly and discern the ways in which we are called to be signs of hope to those we meet in our own lives. Prayer: God of Light, empowered with the fire of your Spirit, may we be signs and bringers of hope in the darkness of our world. Amen.

Back in the 1960s in Milan, the council were developing the metro system and were stopped in their tracks. They found an ancient crypt underneath the Cathedral. Among the ruins they found an octagonal shape that can clearly be seen with steps going down one side into what was a pool and with steps going up out of the other side. This was no ancient roman spa bath but a baptistry. In 387 a man called Augustine was baptised by Ambrose: and, of course, we remember that Augustine was 32 years old and how he famously kept delaying his baptism, struggling with a restlessness throughout his life, despite the fervent prayers of his mother, Monica. For those of us who are baptised, even if we were not plunged into the pools in the dramatic style of Augustine, the reality is the same. We entered that same pool of life, history and tradition: the same waters that Jesus entered in at the Jordan. But like those ruins buried deep under il duomo, hidden beneath the great sight of Milan's cathedral, our faith and hope need to be uncovered and renewed. Hope is like the baptistry in Milan. For years it was covered over, but it was always there, waiting to be restored. However, many years it is since our baptism, or if we are awaiting baptism — let us ask God to lift us into the living waters. In this Jubilee year, may God excavate our hope.
