On Christmas Eve Pope Francis opened the Holy Door at St Peter's Basilica in Rome. This was the Solemn Opening of the Jubilee Year which will continue throughout 2025. In the heart of each person, hope dwells as the desire and expectation of good things to come, despite our not knowing what the future may bring." (Spes non confundit, #1) . Can we dream of peace in a time of war? Can this Holy Year be a time for all of us to make a commitment to build peace?

"May the Jubilee remind us that those who are peacemakers will be called 'children of God' (Mt 5:9). The need for peace challenges us all and demands that concrete steps be taken." (Spes non confundit, #8)
